The Psychosocial Rehabilitation Day Program is based on the belief that recovery is possible for individuals who are suffering from behavioral health disorders. The program creates an environment where an individual's strengths are recognized and shared with others in a supportive environment.

The program reflects reality through daily structure, interactions with peers, staff, and the larger community. When individuals are lacking in the skills needed to cope, the program teaches and reinforces those skills through the individualized service plan (ISP) that each member completes with a psychosocial staff member.
